Project title: E-counselling in co-creation	
<p>Coordinator</p> <p>Savonia University of Applied Sciences</p> <p>Hannele Tams hannele.tams@savonia.fi</p>	<p>First and foremost this project of Savonia University of Applied Sciences (SUAS) and Hanoi National University of Education (HNUE) aim to create tools to apply e-counselling in social services and special education professions. Social work is, by its very nature, aims to support individuals, families and communities to alleviate the difficulties of the life situation and thus promote social inclusion. The covid-19 pandemic rose the need for online special education and social services into everybody’s attention. Leaving aside the pandemic, there is a significant number of people in Vietnam and Finland who are in need of social and educational support but do not have access to those for a variety of reasons such as lack of local resources, financial or health issues.</p>
<p>Partners</p> <p>Hanoi National University of Education</p>	<p>The aim of the project is to develop virtual learning tools on e-counselling to be used in the social work and special education at Bachelor and Master’s levels. The working methods in e-counselling are created through online collaboration between the partner HEIs and also by means of teacher mobility. At this project, also students are involved. Through blended learning activities they will be able to try out the newly developed e-counselling methods with real customers. The designed virtual e-counselling module is built in cooperation with working life, and it includes an element of internships in e-guidance contexts.</p> <p>As a result of the project, teachers in participating organizations will gain a good understanding on utilizing online tools in counselling. They will be able to pass this knowhow to their students during their professional courses where e-counselling methods can be utilized. Thus, the proficiency of students will increase, and they will be able to serve a larger clientele. This will benefit the communities where the graduates will be working and thus advance the inclusion of individuals and equality of the community.</p>



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
