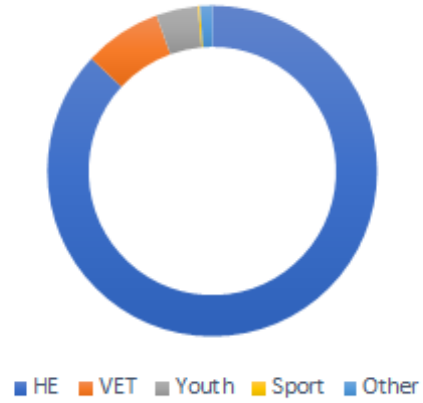

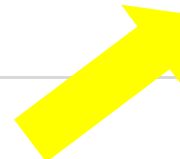
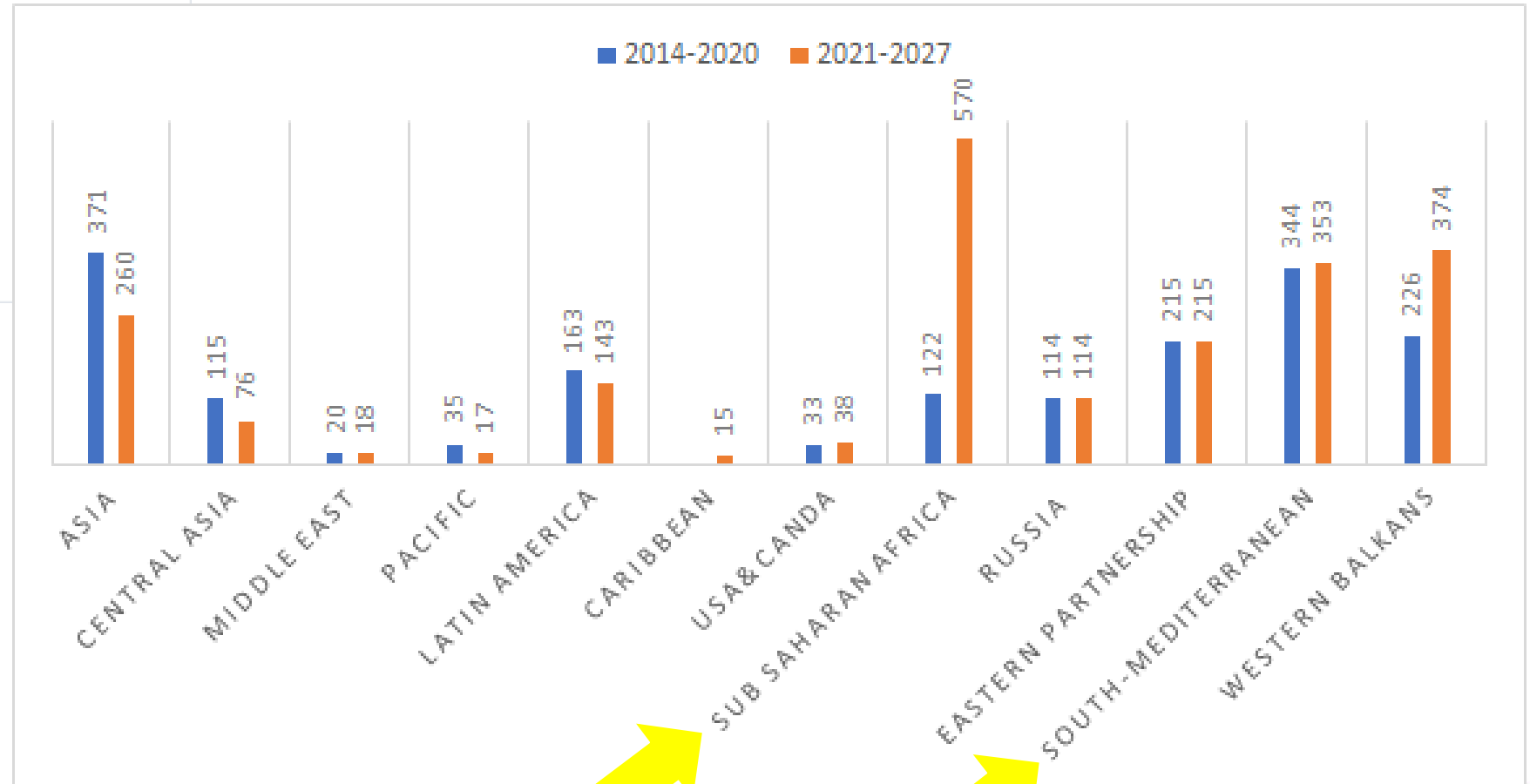


International Dimension of Erasmus+

2021-2027: 2,2 billion

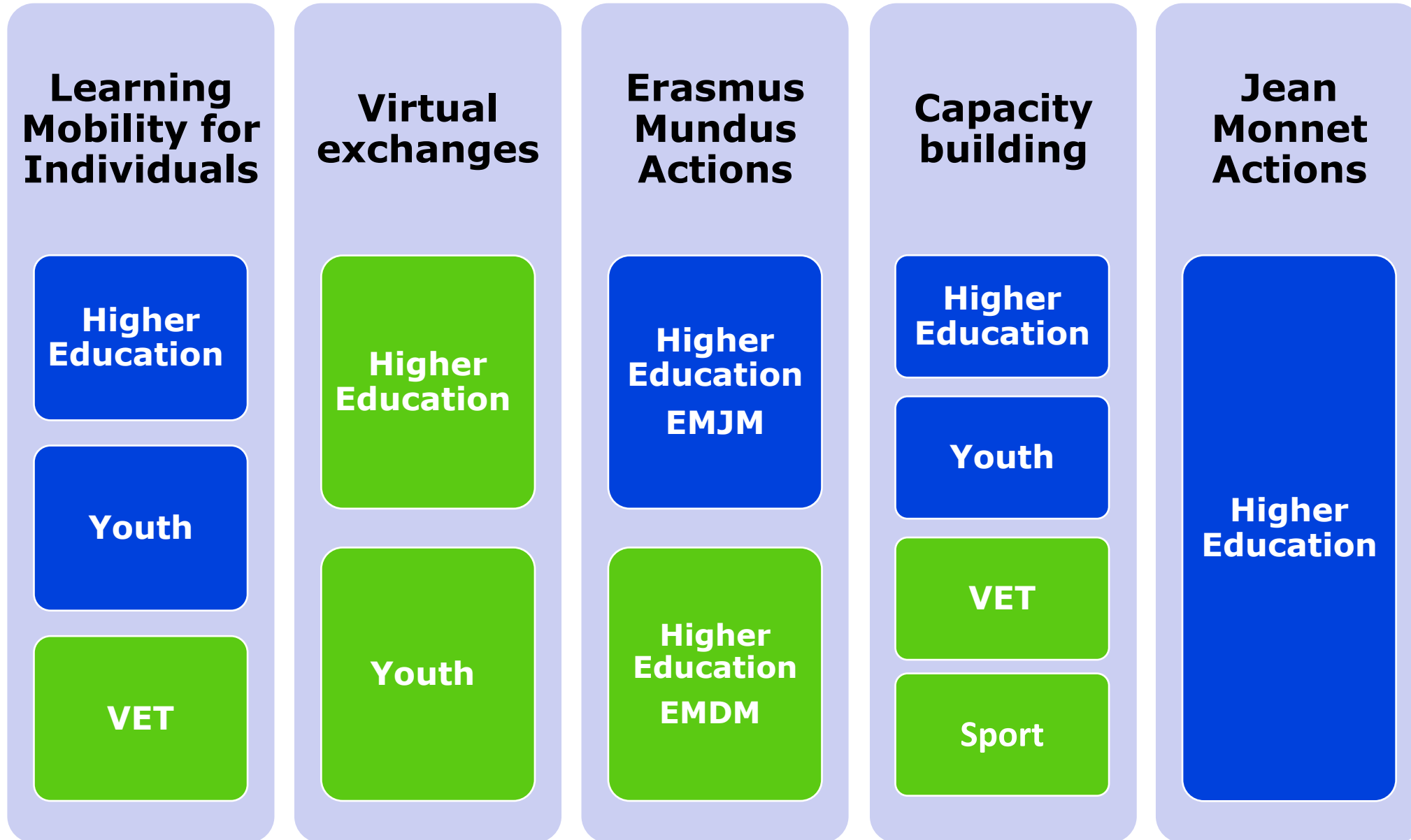



Impacts of Erasmus+

Since 1992, over 300,000 Finns have participated in periods abroad supported by Erasmus+ and the programmes preceding it. With the help of the programme, participants have improved their language proficiency, international competence and cooperation skills. For example, educational institutions and organisations have exchanged good practices, developed joint study modules, created new operating models and methods, developed the practices of youth work, and promoted the European sports policy in cooperation with their international partners.
