START BY DESIGNING AN INITIAL PROJECT IDEA!

Before inviting potential partners to co-design a project in the Hub, it is essential to clarify the project's objectives, planned activities, and desired outcomes. Define the challenge, need, or problem the project addresses. Collaboration is smoother when partners understand what they are committing to, and providing a ready-made project table with suggested roles can make participation easier and more concrete.

GO TO THE HUB AND POST A CALL FOR PARTNERS IN THE WORKSPACE

Once you have become a member of the Hub head over to their workspace on Microsoft Teams. You'll find a channel called "Projects and Funding" - your space to share ideas and invite others to collaborate. When drafting your post, focus on clearly presenting the project's purpose and the role or expectations you envision for potential partners. Or invite them to co-create their contribution!
