<p>Coordinator</p> <p>Karelia Ammattikorkeakoulu Oy</p> <p>Kirsi Tanskanen kirsi.tanskanen@karelia.fi</p>	<p>Nursing Care beyond the Pandemic World, Care4World is a collaboration project between Airlangga University in Indonesia (UNAIR), Karelia University of Applied Sciences (Karelia) and Metropolia University of Applied Sciences (Metropolia) in Finland in the degree program of Nursing.</p> <p>The aim of the project is to develop the future competence development of nurses supported by transversal skills, such as multicultural and digitalization competence in the contexts of global health. The project builds a joint international learning network to enable the students to develop the competences for the future.</p> <p>Project activities include an online webinar, workshops during the exchange periods in the partner countries and participation in joint events (e.g., Karelia and Metropolia International Weeks and UNAIR online nursing conference). The activities include student and teacher/staff exchanges to create a learning and mobility pathway and strengthen the collaboration and cultural understanding between partners.</p>
