Attention to this issue in research, policy-making, services and public debates is growing, but what counts as co-production and what interaction between science and society should entail in practice remains often unclear. Leading researchers and lecturers from both countries will share their expertise on values of multiple and often conflicting knowledge and will discuss options available for the integration of the 'formal' and 'informal' in the Arctic research.</p> <p>Interdisciplinary and geographical scope of the planned course offers a possibility to gain more complex picture of the issue in the comparative context. Existing concepts, approaches and practices in the field of co-production will be represented from the perspectives of climate change-, identity-, indigenous studies as well as of tourism-, industrial development- and legal issues. PhD students will learn about different forms of knowledge, values and social relations and how research results could be converted into knowledge, supporting sustainable processes in the society.</p>
